


### Where is Egypt?






### Eqypt

- Most people in Africa of any country (82M)
- 15<sup>th</sup> most populous in the world
- Longest history of any modern state
- Ancient civilization was very advanced
- Created much influence in art and culture



### Close Up of Eqypt

- Capital today is Cairo
- Size of texas and california combined
- People live in cities along the Nile river
- Official Language :
  Arabic

- Carried by hand




### Giza – still exists





# The Sphinx




Protects the tombs of kings: wisdom and strength



## The Tombs / Mummys


- Rich people were "mummified" it was very expensive
- Buried so that when you reached the next world, you would have all your riches with you





## The Tombs / Mummys

- Because Eqypt is a very dry place, where it hardly ever rains, the ground there is also very very dry.
- When you bury people in such dry ground, they gradually dry up and turn into mummies.





- farmers

### Art in Africa

- 10,000 BC carvings of giraffes and other animals on stones in the Sahara desert.
- 7500 BC Egyptian artists were carving on rocks, especially in Upper Egypt.
- 3000 BC hieroglyphs were created rock walls with drawings with stone and paint







### Language grew...from scratch!

- Drawings of familiar objects, simplified to make them easier to draw.
- At first people just drew a dog or a <a href="https://house.no.in/house">house</a> or a <a href="https://sheep">sheep</a>;
  for example some early writing is just a picture of a sheep with five lines by it to mean "five sheep."
- Then people began to combine pictures for meaning For example so that a picture of a sheep means the sound "sh" and can be combined with a picture of an owl "hoot" to mean the word "shoot," for example (only in Egyptian of course, not in English really!).



### Writing on rocks...to paper

- Used papyrus a plant that grows wild all over the <u>Nile river valley</u>, very common in Egypt.
- Cut the long stalks
- Soak them in water until they rot a little,
- Lay a lot of these stalks next to each other, on top, crossways to the first ones,
- Pound them flat, until all the stalks get mashed into all the other ones
- Voila!! PAPER!



### Hieroglyphs

- Means "sacred drawings" in Greek to express themselves
- 3000 BC to about 300 AD .
- The Greeks conquered Egypt under Alexander the Great, people began to use the Greek alphabet to write the Egyptian language.
- After hieroglyphs were only used for religious things and art that were too holy for the ordinary Greek alphabet, which is why they are called "sacred-drawings."
- By 300 AD, as people converted to Christianity, there was no longer any religious use for hieroglyphs, and they went out of use altogether.
