1st Grade Art Appreciation Pierre Auguste Renoir, "A Girl With A Watering Can"

Pierre Auguste Renoir

- 1. Renoir was a French painter who was an "Impressionist" (a distinct style of painting).
- 2. Child -- constantly drawing pictures, 13 yrs old paid to paint flowers on dishes. Then painted fans and religious story pictures on stained glass.
- 3. Saved enough money to go to art school -- met Monet and other famous artists who became lifelong friends. They became the "Impressionist" artists -- an distinct interest in color compatibility.
- 4. He Married and had 3 sons. Financially secure and admired by the public.
- 5. As he aged he became arthritic. He had to remain in a wheel chair. Loved to paint so much that he had pain brushed tied to his hands so he could paint.

"A Girl With A Watering Can"

- 1. What is the focal point of the painting? (the girl)
- 2. Colors used? Where else do we see blue/green together? (sky/trees & bushes/grass)
- 3. Why red for the girl's hair bow? (red is a compliment to green -- across from one another on the color wheel.) Important to the impressionists; used color to portray movement and ??
- 4. What color used most often? (green)
- 5. Painting divided horizontally -- to give perspective. Where is the girl in relation to everything else.
- 6. Why do you think the girls is holding the watering can? What is she wearing? Would you wear that to water flowers?
- 7. What is the weather like? How do you know? What colors help you know this?
- 8. Where might the path lead?

Activity

- 1. Show kids the color chart/wheel. Explain complimentary colors.
- 2. Give each child a chart and read the colors together.
- 3. At tables, tape a paint brush to each students hand (like Renoir had to do) and let them paint the color chart with the water colors.
